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Welcome by Sylvie Retailleau, French Minister for Higher Education and Research



In the field of higher education, research and innovation, the French Presidency has set three objectives:

. To promote European knowledge policies in order to support recovery and transitions in Europe, by strengthening synergies between higher education, research, innovation and services to society,

. To affirm the international dimension of these policies in order to contribute to the deployment of European power in the world and to strengthen the attractiveness of Europe for teachers, researchers and students,

. To deepen the sense of European belonging, by supporting European universities in their action to transmit the European way of life and by removing obstacles to transnational cooperation between institutions in Europe.

At the start of the Presidency, in January, we brought together ministers, the Commission, higher education stakeholders and their partners in a Forum of Universities for the Future of Europe.

The rich and valuable discussions at this Forum contributed to the work of the Council, which resulted in two important initiatives in April 2022: <u>Council conclusions on a European strategy</u> <u>empowering higher education institutions for the future of Europe</u> and a <u>Council Recommendation on building bridges for effective European higher education cooperation</u>. They set a course for the development of the European higher education sector in the coming years by strengthening alliances between institutions and propose the creation of new tools to bring European cooperation to an unprecedented level of ambition: degrees with a European dimension, statutes dedicated to alliances, international projection and more sustainable funding.

Together, Member States, the Commission and stakeholders in the sector, we have defined the milestones, the objectives and the instruments: what remains to be done is to commit ourselves to making European universities a concrete and tangible reality for our students, our partners throughout the world and our citizens.

On behalf of the French Presidency of the Council of the European Union, I am proud to welcome the key players in higher education and research in Europe and the representatives of the 41 European university alliances to Versailles, at the Palais des Congrès. I am also proud to close the Presidency with this major conference of European universities, which the President of the Republic called for on last December. This gathering will allow us to take stock of this initiative and to reflect on the challenges that the alliances still have to face in order to build this European network for the creation and sharing of knowledge at the service of students and society as a whole.

Presentation of the event


The Campus of European Universities is the final French Presidency conference gathering all European universities. Announced by the President of the French Republic, Emmanuel Macron, the event is co-organized by the French ministry for higher education and research (MESR) with the French conference of University rectors (France Universités), in partnership with the ministry for Europe and Foreign affairs, the French Erasmus+ Agency as well as Campus France, the French Agency for the promotion of higher education.

The <u>Council conclusions on a European strategy empowering higher education institutions for</u> the future of Europe, approved on the 5th of April, identify four key objectives to foster the contribution of higher education institutions to the future of Europe: (1) strengthen the European dimension in higher education, research and innovation as well as the synergies between them; (2) drive Europe's global role and leadership; (3) bolster Europe's recovery and response to the digital and green transitions and (4) deepen the European sense of belonging based on common values. Together with the <u>Council Recommendation on building bridges for</u> <u>effective European higher education cooperation</u>, they invite Member States and the European Commission to set up measures aiming at boosting and sustaining alliances such as "European universities", through inter allia an European label for joint degrees, institutionalised cooperation instruments, such as a possible legal status, and new approaches for a comprehensive and integrated funding.

To launch this new phase, it is important to take stock of the overall progress and impact of the European Universities Initiative and the diversity of models of alliances of higher education institutions. Accordingly, the Campus is made up of two parallel components, which are intended to complement each other:

- Plenaries and workshops allowing for a dialogue between alliances of European universities, Member States, European Commission, and different stakeholders representing the higher education sector and their partners, in order to:
 - 1) Highlight the contribution of European universities as hallmarks of the European model;
 - 2) Strengthen exchanges between alliances to contribute to the European strategy;
 - 3) Support the global dimension of European universities.
- The "Village of the Alliances", which is a space dedicated to the presentation of the alliances of European universities (41 Alliances selected under the Erasmus+ programme, as well as the University of the Greater Region and EUCOR). This will allow Alliances to showcase their activities and results, via **exhibition booths**. The task of mobilizing all the Alliances to participate in this "Village of the Alliances" has been entrusted by the MESR to the two Forums of Alliances (FOREU1 and FOREU2), in collaboration with France Universités. Beyond the participants of the Campus, the Village is also open to other guests, such as HEIs from third countries, students' organisations or regional and economic partners.

Biographies (alphabetic order)

Alberto Barbieri

Dr. Barbieri has a degree in accounting from the University of Buenos Aires. He holds a Master's degree in Business Administration and Management from the European School of Business in Spain and a PhD from the University of Buenos Aires. Dr Barbieri has specialised in the management of health organisations and information systems, as well as in the evaluation, implementation and monitoring of investment projects in the social fields -health, social security and social action- and productive development. He has been rector of Buenos Aires University (UBA) since 2014. At the same university, he was vice-rector, dean of the Faculty of Economics and president of UBATEC, a technology transfer company.

Clément Beaune

Clément Beaune is graduated from the « Institut d'études politiques » (IEP) in Paris, from the « Collège d'Europe » in Bruges ("Montesquieu" class) and a former student of the « École nationale d'administration » ("Willy Brandt" class). In 2011, he became deputy head of the research and higher education department at the National Budget Office of the Finance Ministry. From 2014 to 2016, he was advisor in charge of European, international and budgetary affairs in the office of the Minister for the Economy, Industry and Digital Affairs. From 2017 to 2020, Clément Beaune was special advisor for Europe at the French Presidency. From 2020 to 2022, Clément Beaune was Secretary of State in charge of European Affairs at the ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs. In May 2022, he is appointed Minister Delegate at the ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs, responsible for Europe.

Vanessa Debiais Sainton

Vanessa Debiais Sainton is Head of the Unit *Higher Education*, DGEAC, European Commission. She is responsible for the development of the higher education dimension of the European Education Area, for the implementation of, among others, the European Strategy for Universities, the Common European Diploma and the European Student Card initiative.

Renaud Dehousse

Professor Renaud Dehousse has been President of the European University Institute since 1 September 2016. Prior to this, he was a Professor and holder of the Jean Monnet Chair of European Law and Policy Studies at Sciences Po Paris, where he founded and directed the Centre for European Studies. He chaired Sciences Po's Board from 2013 to 2016. Before joining Sciences Po in 1999, he taught at the European University Institute, then at the University of Pisa. Renaud Dehousse was a scientific advisor to the centre for study and research founded by Jacques Delors, Notre Europe. He was a member of several working parties on the reform of European institutions established by the European institutions and national governments. His research has covered multiple aspects of European law and politics. He is a member of the **Academia Europaea**.

Azzeddine El Midaoui

Since 2014, Professor Azzeddine El Midaoui is the President of the Ibn Tofail University – Kenitra. Since 2015, he is also President of the Conference of University Presidents of Morocco. He has received several scientific awards including the "University-Business Partnership Prize" awarded by the Ministry of Higher Education of Morocco.

Sophia Eriksson-Waterschott

Sophia Eriksson Waterschoot is Director for Youth, Education and Erasmus+ at the European Comission's Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture. She is in charge of the European cooperation on higher education, schools and youth policy, including Europe's flagship programmes Erasmus+ and the European Solidarity Corps. She has previously held various positions within the Commission in the field of strategy and investment in education, labour market policy, the European Semester and the European cohesion funds. She studied Economics, Business and Political Science, and did an Erasmus student exchange in France. She is also an Eisenhower Fellow.

Laurence Farreng

Working initially as publicist for private companies, Laurence Farreng (French political party "MoDem") became director of communications for her city, Pau, from 2015 to 2019 after being deputy mayor. She has been a Member of the European Parliament since 2019, elected on the Renaissance list (presidential majority). She was elected Regional Councillor for New Aquitaine in 2021. Laurence Farreng is a full member and coordinator of the Committee on Culture and Education (CULT). She was a member of the Conference on the Future of Europe. In the European Parliament, Laurence Farreng notably works on the democratisation and adaptation to environmental challenges of the European Union's flagship programmes in the field of education and culture: Erasmus +, the European Solidarity Corps for volunteering and Creative Europe.

Mariya Gabriel

Mariya Gabriel is the European Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education, Youth and Sport. Under her leadership, the new Horizon Europe, Erasmus+, and the cultural strand of Creative Europe programmes (2021-2027) were defined and are implemented. She has extensively engaged with external EU partners to enhance digital cooperation, in particular with the Western Balkans and Africa. She was elected as Member of the European Parliament (MEP) in 2009, 2014 and 2019. Mariya Gabriel is First Vice-President of the European People's Party (EPP), and, since 2012, Vice-President of EPP Women.

Jakub Grodecki

Jakub Grodecki, currently serving as a Vice President of the European Students' Union. His primary focus within the organization is Quality of Higher Education, Bologna Process implementation and Higher Education digitalisation. He is also co-founder of the Slovenian biotechnology company Animacel. He is also a representative of the Eutopia Alliance, coordinated by the French University of Cergy.

Merryl Moneghetti

Merryl Moneghetti coordinates and presents « Lectures from the Collège de France » on the French public radio, France Culture. The program is « teaching science in the making ». After a master's degree at Sciences Po Paris, under the direction of Jean-Noël Jeanneney, where she specialized in the history of the evolution of the media and on François Mauriac, «writerjournalist», she joined Radio France, in 2004. She produced «Mauriac et Cie croquent la télé» and she worked from 2013 à 2019, with the French journalist Christine Ockrent, who produces a radio program on foreign affairs every Saturday. Christina Moberg

Christina Moberg is emeritus professor of organic chemistry at KTH Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm.
